Spotlight on an Old Concordian

Q&A with Angus McFarlane Class of 1996

We caught up with Old Concordian Angas McFarlane for a Q&A.



You have a complex job, can you tell us a bit about it and how you got involved?

As the Operations Manager at Polair, I was lucky to work with a team that made a real difference in how SAPOL make safe communities throughout South Australia. Being able to jump into a plane or a helicopter everyday was a real privilege. When I joined SAPOL, I had no experience working with aircraft but I was offered a part time role as a helicopter tactical flight officer (TFO). 10 years later I was fortunate to win the position of Operations manager and see the unit expand to using helicopters and planes. Some of the most satisfying memories are from conducting Search and Rescue Operations - rescuing people from overturned boats off Kangaroo Island through to vehicle break downs in the Simpson Desert.

Would you recommend your career path to current students?

I would recommend a career in the South Australia Police to anyone. It is a job that offers incredible variety and flexibility. In my 20 years as a Police Officer I have been in General Duties as a patrol officer, Criminal Investigation Branch as a Detective, Tactical Operator in the Special Tasks and Rescue Group, Manager of Polair and now, a senior manager at Police Headquarters. The great thing about SAPOL is the variety of jobs available and the ability to move between careers whilst having the security of remaining in the one organisation. I have made lifelong friends in the police and have grown as a person by being exposed to the reality of life in Australia, seeing both the best and worst.

What are your fondest/ funniest memories of Concordia?

I think my funniest memory of Concordia was playing football in the quadrangle and an 'un-named' student kicked the ball through the principal's office window! My fondest memory would be the musicals. The friendships formed during rehearsals and the performances and for Concordia giving me the fleeting idea that I had some singing ability.

How has Concordia helped shape your life?

Concordia College provided me with a safe space to grow as a young adult and gave me the confidence to tackle all of life's challenges. Not always successfully but with enough resilience and reflection to learn from my failures and benefit from the experience. I still have great friends from school that I can rely on if needed.

Is there any advice would you give to students?


Work hard at school (nothing worth achieving is easy) but don't stress if things don't go to plan. Life isn't perfect and things will happen that are unexpected. It is how we deal with the unexpected things that affect how much we enjoy life (ie don't worry yourself about things you can't change). And lastly, don't compare yourself to others. We are all different. Find what works for you.

Kelsey Bright Class of 2016

Kelsey had set herself an incredible task in 2025, we asked her to tell us about it!



Where has life taken you since CC?

When I finished school in 2016, I was pretty unwell (with endometriosis) so I took year off to have surgery and to try and get better before starting uni the following year. I studied Occupational Therapy, and I now live and work in London with my partner Ollie (Class of 2013). We have spent the last 12 months working in the NHS and travelling Europe which has been a long-time dream of ours.

Tell us about The End to End for Endometriosis

In August/ September of 2025 I am going to be walking from the top of Scotland to the bottom of England to raise money for Endometriosis Australia. It will be about 1600km and we are calling it the End to End for Endometriosis! We have the goal of raising further awareness for endometriosis (and \$50k!), an illness that has had a big impact on mine and my family's life as well as many others.

The walk is representative of all the women who show up each day despite experiencing debilitating symptoms.



How can our community support you?

Any support that the community feels able to give is hugely appreciated. If you aren't in a position to donate, then just starting a conversation about endometriosis or providing support to someone that may be struggling with the illness can go a long way.

What motivates you?

This idea was created on a day when my Granny was in hospital with endometriosis complications in Australia, and I was in Scotland and stuck in bed because of the same. I am motivated by all the days of pain, nausea and fatigue that impact quality of life for so many women. This walk is our way of fighting for a better future for women living with endo, which can't be done without increasing awareness, compassion and resources.

What advice would you give to students?

I think my advice would be something that I keep trying to remind myself of... which is to not be afraid of discomfort and doing hard things! It can apply to when you aren't sure if you want to keep persisting to get an assignment handed up on time, or if you are nervous about going to that party. If you are thinking that maybe you won't try out for that team, in case you don't get in or want to stop playing music because of that solo performance. The determination you show in these moments to do something despite it being uncomfortable, hard or scary, will support you in all the years to come.

It was not until 1970 that the game known as women's basketball in Australia officially became netball.


